

Department 10 — 4-H AND VOCATIONAL

RULES

1. 4-H Club members must have passed their eighth birthday but not have passed their nineteenth birthday by January 1 of the current year. **Exhibitors must be 4-H members and present a project book at time of entry presentation in the field in which they wish to make entry and be under the supervision of Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension Service by July 1 preceding the fair.**
2. **Students enrolled in an accepted vocational school curriculum must present a project book or log book in the class in which they wish to make an entry. Students enrolled in general home economics class in a comprehensive high school are considered as qualifying and must present note from teacher.** All entries shall be approved prior to the fair by a member of Pennsylvania Department of Education, Agriculture or Family and Consumer Science staff, or their designated representative.
3. 4-H & FFA—Any animal in the club groups may be shown in the open classes. 4-H & FFA exhibitor shall include any boy or girl who is an Active Member in 4-H or FFA in Lancaster County. The animal shown must be their club project. All entries to be judged as individuals.

RULES

1. **ELIGIBILITY**—The FFA and 4-H dairy beef steer show is open to active members in Lampeter-Strasburg and Penn Manor School Districts. See Page 18 for FFA eligibility.
2. All dairy beef must be Holstein or Brown Swiss born between Jan. 1 - February 28, 2011.
3. **ENTRIES**—Each exhibitor is to enter their animal with Neil Fellenbaum at 872-9520 Ext. 1590 on or before September 10. There will be no entry charge.
4. **OWNERSHIP**—Dairy beef must be secured by Feb. 28 and be in the care of the FFA or 4-H member. Each member is to have entire charge and care of his/her animal. FFA and 4-H members can only sell one dairy beef per member.
5. **HEALTH**—No animal showing evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease including ringworm, warts, lice, and mange will be accepted to the show and/or sale. Dairy beef must be dehorned and castrated. All animals must be accompanied by an approved Certificate of Veterinary Inspection prepared by an accredited veterinarian issued after May 1, 2011 and have unique permanent identification (tattoo or ear tag). No brucellosis test is required and no Tuberculosis test is required. An "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" form located on page 20 must be presented upon arrival to the fair. Forms can also be obtained from FFA Advisors or 4-H Leaders.
6. ALL dairy beef are to be entered from 1:00 - 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday and remain on the grounds until the conclusion of the Livestock sale on Friday evening.
7. All animals must be halter broke and trained to lead without the use of artificial means.
8. All animals are to be fitted and prepared for show by the exhibitor. The beef committee strongly recommends that clipping of animals is done at home.
9. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, bedding and related equipment.
10. **LIABILITY** – Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done arising from any animals exhibited by him if such loss or damage is due to negligence on his part. Any individual, spectator, or patron handling animals without the consent of the owner is liable for all damage or injury done to themselves or animals.
11. All exhibitors showing animals must present an up-to-date project book at time of weigh-in. Before showing first-time exhibitors need to have attended an ethics and responsibility meeting.
12. **WEIGHING** – Exhibitors must be present when the dairy beef are weighed. Dairy beef will be weighed Tuesday and will be sold on Friday night based on that weight. Dairy beef weighing less than 400 pounds may not be shown and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately after weighing. The decision of the weigh master is final. There will be no reweighs. Classes will be divided according to weights after weigh-in.
13. Judging will be done by weight classes. The committee will determine the number of classes and the number of entries per class.
14. The first place individual in each weight class shall be eligible to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion of the show.
15. All dairy beef shown must be sold at the auction on Friday evening. Following the sale all dairy beef must be tied with a good rope halter.

RULES

1. **ELIGIBILITY** - The Steer show is open to any active 4-H or FFA member who resides in the Lampeter-Strasburg or Penn Manor School Districts.
2. **OWNERSHIP**- Steers must be secured by Feb 1 and be in the care of the 4-H or FFA member. Each member is to have entire charge and care of his/her animal. 4-H and FFA members can only show and sell one steer per member. Steers are to be of an industry recognized beef breed.
3. **HEALTH** – No animal showing evidence of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease including ringworm, warts, lice and mange will be accepted to the show and /or sale. All cattle must be castrated. All animals must be accompanied by an approved Certificate of Veterinary Inspection prepared by an accredited veterinarian and issued after May 1, 2011 and have a unique permanent identification (tattoo, RFID or ear tag). An “Animal Owner or Caretaker’s Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship” form located on page 20 must be presented upon arrival to the fair.
4. All steers must be halter broke and able to lead without use of artificial means. **ANY STEER THAT CANNOT BE SATISFACTORILY HANDLED, or SHOWS SIGN OF LAMENESS MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIR-GROUNDS. The decision of the beef committee will be final.**
5. **TIME AND WEIGHING** – All steer are to be entered from 8 am to 9 pm on Tuesday and remain on the fair grounds until the conclusion of the Livestock sale on Friday evening. Steer will be sold based on their weight at weigh-in. Any steer weighing less than 1000 pounds may not be shown and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately after weighing. The decision of the weigh master is final. There will be no reweighs.
6. All steers shown in market classes must be sold in the auction on Friday evening. Following the sale all steers must be tied with a good rope halter.
7. **FITTING** – All animals are to be fitted and prepared for show by the exhibitor with the assistance of an immediate family member, 4-H or FFA member, adult club leader/Ag Ed Advisor. The beef committee strongly recommends that clipping of animals is done at home.
8. **CARE OF ANIMALS**-The exhibitor must furnish all feed and related equipment. **MULCH WILL BE PROVIDED FOR BEDDING, ABSOLUTELY NO STRAW WILL BE ALLOWED FOR BEEF CATTLE**
