

9. **LIABILITY-** Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done arising from any animals exhibited by him/her if such loss or damage is due to negligence on his/her part. Any individual, spectator, or patron handling animals without the consent of the owner is liable for all damage or injury done to themselves or animals.
10. **JUDGING** – Judging will be done by weight. The committee will determine the number of classes and the number of entries per class. A Grand and Reserve Champion will be chosen.
11. **NOTE- For the 2012 Lampeter Fair, all exhibitors must have their project steer identified by their 4-H leader or Ag Advisor by April 1st. Leader or Advisor should report to Jay Hess exhibitors name, address, phone number and animal i.d. (ear tag, tattoo, etc.)**

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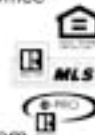


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

RULES

1. **ELIGIBILITY**—The FFA and 4-H Sheep show is open to active members in Lampeter-Strasburg, Penn Manor, Solanco School District and Pequea Valley. See Page 18 for FFA eligibility.
2. Each exhibitor may enter and sell 2 market lambs. Entries are to be made with Neil Fellenbaum at 872-9520 Ext. 1590 or Michelle Winters at 687-9303 on or before September 10. Entries will be accepted on a first come-first served basis in order of registration. Sale lambs may not have been sold at a previous fair. There will be no entry charge.
3. **OWNERSHIP**—Market lambs must be secured by June 1 and be in the care of the FFA or 4-H members. Each member is to have entire charge and care of his/her animal. All market lambs will be wethers or ewes and may not be shown in the breeding classes. FFA and 4-H members who participate in both organizations must determine which organization the animals will be entered in by June 1. This information (scrapie ear tag numbers) must be reported and recorded by the adult advisor/leader. This information will be verified at the fair. If there are discrepancies, the animals will be disqualified and immediately removed from the fairgrounds. All prize money and awards will be forfeited.
4. **HEALTH**—To qualify, all animals must be free of any evidence of transmissible disease, including external parasites, sore mouth, and foot rot, and be clearly identified on an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection of the state of origin. All male market lambs must be castrated. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be prepared by an accredited veterinarian and issued after May 1, 2011. A copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must accompany the sheep to the show and be available for inspection at all times during the show as additional inspections of sheep health certificates may be made. All lambs must be docked.

An "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" form on page 20 must be presented upon arrival to the fair. Forms can also be obtained from FFA Advisors or 4-H Leaders.
5. **IMPORTANT RULE — Certification by the owner and an accredited veterinarian that the identified animal(s) is (are) not known to have been exposed to scrapie.**
6. **All sheep must bear an official USDA/APHIS ear tag to be exhibited at the show. Sheep from flocks on the voluntary scrapie program must bear the official ear tag, tattoo, or electronic ear implant.**
7. Any animals of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions, must be removed from the fairgrounds.
8. All exhibitors showing animals must present an up-to-date project book at time of weigh-in. Before showing exhibitors need to have attended an ethics and responsibility meeting.
9. **TIME AND WEIGHING** — Exhibitors must be present when the market lambs are weighed. Lambs will be weighed between 1 pm and 9 pm on Tuesday and will be sold on Friday night based on that weight. Lambs weighing under 90 pounds and over 150 pounds may not be shown and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately after weighing. The decision of the weigh master is final; there will be no reweighs. Classes will be divided according to weights after weigh-in.

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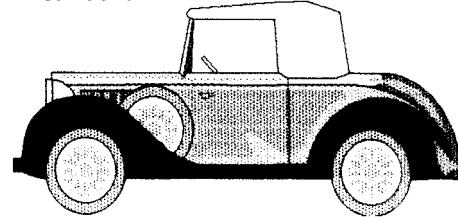
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10. CARE OF ANIMALS — The exhibitor must furnish all feed, feed troughs and water pails. Each exhibitor feeds and cares for his animals during the Fair.
11. LIABILITY — Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done arising from any animals exhibited by him, if such loss or damage is due to negligence on his part. Any individual, spectator or patron handling animals without the consent of the owner is liable for all damage or injury done to themselves or animals.
12. JUDGING—The decision of the judge(s) shall be final in all cases. Where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his discretion, award a prize of such grade as the animal deserves. In each weight division the classes may be divided as needed.
 - A. Any exhibitor may show two animals per class.
 - B. Exhibitor must be present during judging of classes they have entered.
 - C. The show person must do their own fitting to compete in the Lampeter Fair Sheep Show.
 - D. The first place animal in each weight class will be eligible to compete as champion of the FFA and 4-H shows. There will be no reserve champions selected.
 - E. Sheep may not be led by halter for Sr. Showmanship classes.
 - F. The committee strongly recommends that clipping/shearing be done at home.
13. No market/sale animals may be removed from the fairgrounds before the conclusion of the Beef, Swine, Lamb, Dairy Beef and Market Goat sale on Friday night. All animals must be removed from the fairgrounds by 8 am Saturday.
14. All exhibitors are to be present for clean-up on Saturday morning following the fair.

RULES

1. Eligibility—The FFA and 4-H Swine show is open to active members in Lampeter-Strasburg, Penn Manor, Solanco and Pequea Valley School Districts. See Page 18 for FFA eligibility.
2. ENTRIES—FFA Entries are to be made with Neil Fellenbaum at 872-9520 Ext. 1590 and 4-H Entries with Michelle Winters at 687-9303 on or before September 10. Limit two (2) hogs per exhibitor. Entries will be accepted on a first come-first served basis in order of registration. There will be no entry charge.
3. All exhibitors showing animals must present an up-to-date project book at time of weigh-in. Before showing exhibitors need to have attended an ethics and responsibilities meeting.
4. WEIGHT—All hogs must be received between 1 pm and 9 pm Tuesday. To be eligible for the show and sale, hogs must weigh between 230 lbs. and 280 pounds. Any animals not in that weight range will be rejected and MUST leave the fairgrounds that evening. Weighmasters decision is final — there will be NO reweighs. Exhibitors must be present to help weigh and tag their market hogs.
5. OWNERSHIP—Market hogs must be secured by July 1 and be in the care of the FFA or 4-H member. Each member is to have entire charge and care of his/her animal. All market hogs will be gilts or barrows. FFA and 4-H members who participate in both organizations must determine which organization the animals will be entered in by July 1. This information (ear tag numbers, etc.) must be reported and recorded by the adult advisor/leader. This information will be verified at the fair. If there are discrepancies, the animals will be disqualified and immediately removed from the fairgrounds. All prize money and awards will be forfeited.
6. HEALTH—An official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed by an accredited veterinarian must accompany all swine. It must state that the animal(s) show no signs of contagious or infectious diseases. The certificate must be issued after May 1, 2011 and list all animals. Any hog showing any physical evidence of communicable disease or unthriftiness will not be admitted to the show. An "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" form located on page 20 must be presented upon arrival to the fair. Forms can also be obtained from a FFA Advisor or 4-H Leader.
7. Pork Quality Assurance—All exhibitors need to be PQA (Pork Quality Assurance) certified and must present their certificate card at the scales on Tuesday.
8. CARE OF THE ANIMALS—the exhibitor must furnish all feed, feed troughs, water pails, etc. Each exhibitor feeds and cares for his animals during the Fair.
9. Clipping — If hogs are clipped for the show and sale the hair length must be no shorter than 3/4 inch.



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10. **LIABILITY**—Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done arising from any animals exhibited by him, if such loss or damage is due to negligence on his part. Any individual, spectator or patron handling animals without the consent of the owner is liable for all damage or injury done to themselves or animals.
11. **JUDGING**—The decision of the judge shall be final in all cases. Where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his discretion, award a prize of such grade as the animal deserves. Any exhibitor may show 2 animals in a class.
12. The first place animal in each weight class will be eligible to compete as champion of that weight division. Division champions will compete for Champion of the FFA or 4-H show. There will be no reserve champions selected.
13. No market/sale animals may be removed from the fairgrounds before the conclusion of the Beef, Swine, Lamb, Dairy Beef and Goat sale on Friday night. All animals must be removed from the fairgrounds by 8 am Saturday.
14. All exhibitors are to be present for clean-up on Saturday morning following the fair.
15. In each division listed below, there will be at least three classes, provided there are a sufficient number of entries.
16. Premiums for each class including showmanship: 1st—\$19.00, 2nd—\$17.00, 3rd—\$15.00, 4th—\$13.00, 5th—\$11.00, 6th-10th—\$9.00.

RULES

1. Eligibility – The Goat show is open to any active 4-H or FFA member who resides in Lampeter-Strasburg or Penn Manor School Districts ONLY.
2. Each exhibitor may enter and sell 2 goats. Entries are to be made with Emily Welk at 687-0351 or eawelk@verizon.net on or **before September 10**. Goats may not have been sold at a previous fair. There will be no entry charge.
3. OWNERSHIP – Market goats must be secured by June 1 and be in the care of the 4-H or FFA member. Each member is to have entire charge and care of his/her animals. All market goats must be either wethers and/or does, no bucks are permitted.
4. HEALTH- All goats must be accompanied by an Animal Owner or Caretaker’s Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2011. No animals showing signs of contagious disease will be permitted on the fairgrounds. All goats entered must be identified with an official Scrapie Tag.
5. Any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show condition, must be removed from the fairgrounds.
6. TIME AND WEIGHING – Goats will be weighed between 1 pm and 9 pm on Tuesday and will be sold on Friday night based on that weight. Goats weighing under 60 lbs and over 115 lbs may not be shown and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately. Classes will be divided according to weights after weigh-in.
7. FITTING - Recommended that all goats be shown “slick shorn”.
8. Goats may either be dis-budded or horned.
9. No “training collars” will be allowed. Smooth small link chain or nylon collars are acceptable.
10. CARE OF ANIMALS - The exhibitor must furnish all feed, feed troughs and water pails. Each exhibitor feeds and cares for his animals during the Fair. Bedding will be provided.
11. JUDGING-The decision of the judge shall be final in all cases.
12. The first place individual in each weight class shall be eligible to complete for Champion and Reserve Champion of the show.
13. Prize money will be as follows:

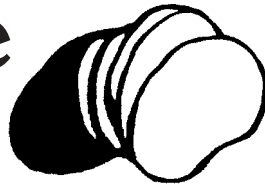

RULES

1. Eligibility – The Pygmy goat show is open to any active 4-H or FFA member who resides in Lampeter-Strasburg, Penn Manor School, Solanco or Pequea Valley School Districts ONLY.
2. Each exhibitor may enter 5 pygmy goats, max. Entries are to be made with Bonni Bauman 872-1300 on or **before September 10**. There will be no entry charge.
3. OWNERSHIP – Pygmy goats must be secured by July 1 and be in the care of the 4-H or FFA member. Each member is to have entire charge and care of his/her animals. All pygmy goats must be owned by the member.
4. HEALTH- All pygmy goats must be accompanied by an Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI). No animals showing signs of contagious disease or parasites will be permitted on the fairgrounds. All pygmy goats entered must be identified with a micro-chip.
5. Any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show condition, must be removed from the fairgrounds.
6. Entry Time– Pygmy goats will be entered on Tuesday between 5 pm and 8 pm. Micro chips will be verified at that time and health papers will be collected. Exhibits may not be removed until 10 pm on Friday night of the fair. Exhibitors are asked to help clean up.
7. FITTING - Animals should be appropriately fitted for the show.
8. Pygmy goats must be dehorned
9. CARE OF ANIMALS - The exhibitor must furnish all feed, feed troughs and water pails. Each exhibitor feeds and cares for his animals during the Fair. Bedding will be provided.
10. JUDGING-The decision of the judge shall be final in all cases.
11. The first and second place individual in each class shall be eligible to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion of the show.
12. Prize money will be as follows:
 Type Class: 1st - \$22, 2nd - \$20, 3rd - \$18, 4th - \$16, 5th - \$14, 6th - 10th - \$12

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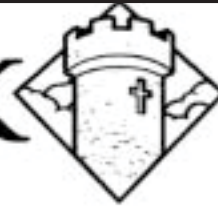
