RULES

CORN

1. Each entry shall consist of ten ears. Entries not having the required number of ears will be disqualified.

Exhibitors may enter in as many classes or subdivision of classes as they wish but no exhibitor shall make more than one entry in a single class for competition, nor can he win more than one prize in a class with one kind of corn.

2. Competition is limited to corn growers of the community. No seedsman or any of his employees will be allowed to compete.

All crops must have been grown by the exhibitor in the community in 2011.

3. Corn shown will become the property of the Fair unless claimed by the exhibitor by 8:30 a.m., Saturday. **No exhibits may be removed from the exhibit room before 10:00 p.m., Friday evening.**

No premium will be awarded in any class, or subdivision of a class, unless the exhibits are worthy. The judge may withhold any premium for lack of merit or may award second or third premium only if deemed best.

4. **JUNIOR EXHIBITORS:** It is your responsibility to tell the department personnel when entering if you are entering under FFA, 4-H, or Open.

5. Suggestions for selecting an exhibit:

Select 50 to 100 of the best ears and reselect 1 or 10 ears to the following points:

- a. Select ripe ears, judged by hardness and dryness of ear, weight of ear and brightness of color.
- b. Condition - ear should be firm and dry, free from mold and rotten kernels.
- c. Uniform - in length and size of ear, number of rows and indentation: Cobs should be bright and of the same color.
- d. Ear should be well proportioned, row of kernels straight and well filled out at butts and tips.

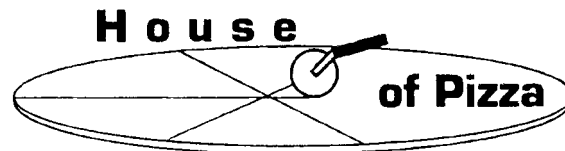
